## Continuing vocational training in enterprises and other organisations, Slovenia, 2005

In 2005 SIT 32,081.8 million (0.49% of GDP, 1.13% of total labour costs) was spent on continuing vocational training of employees in enterprises and other organisations.

In 2005 slightly less funds for continuing vocational training of employees than in 1999

In 2005, 0.17 of a percentage point less funds were spent on continuing vocational training of employees in enterprises and other organisations than in 1999 when the survey was carried out for the first time according to the same methodology.

66.7% of enterprises and organisation in Slovenia are "training enterprises/organisations"

In 2005, 4,902 (66.7%) of the 7,354 enterprises and other organisations in Slovenia were the so-called "training enterprises/organisations". Most of them are medium-sized enterprises employing 50-249 people. This group represented a third of all "training" enterprises and just under a third of all persons in paid employment in "training" enterprises.

Almost a half of employees in "training" enterprises are women

As of 31 December 2005 "training" enterprises and other organisations employed 587,827 people, of whom 275,884 (46.9%) were women. In 2005 these people worked 1,029,144,628 hours, of which women worked 475,339,050 hours or 52.3 hours less than an average man. In 2005 total labour costs in "training" enterprises and organisations amounted to SIT 2,839,919.4 million.

Men spent less time on training than women

In 2005, on average men attended 30.6 hours of training and women two hours more (32.6).

More than SIT 100,000 per participant

In 2005, enterprises and other organisations spent SIT 32,081.7 million on training, which amounts to slightly more than SIT 100,000 per participant.

Small enterprises most willing to train their employees

As regards the size of enterprisers and other organisations, the fewest hours paid for programmes of formal and informal education and training were spent in enterprises employing 250-499 and 500-999 people. In these two groups employees attended on average between 27.5 and 27.9 hours of training. Most hours paid (42.7–48) were spent on training in small enterprises (up to 9 and between 20 and 49 employees). In the largest enterprises (1,000 and more employees) employees spent on average 33.1 paid hours on training.
